

Department-Approved Pathway Assessments in Career and Technical Education

(Updated December 30, 2016)

Students who are otherwise eligible to receive a high school diploma in June 2015 and thereafter must take and pass four required Regents Exams or Department-approved alternative assessments (one in each of the following subjects: English, math, science, and social studies) and either pass a comparably rigorous assessment for a fifth required exam, or in lieu of a fifth exam, complete the requirements to earn the CDOS Commencement Credential. Students may meet the fifth assessment required for graduation by passing a Department-Approved Pathway Assessment in Career and Technical Education (CTE) following successful completion of a CTE programⁱ approved pursuant to §100.5(d)(6) of Commissioner’s regulations. The following assessments and cut score requirements have been approved for use as Department-Approved Pathway Assessments in CTE. A+ Certification (tests CompTIA 220-801 and CompTIA 220-802)	<p>CompTIA A+ certification proves competence in a technician’s ability to perform essential IT tasks such as installation, configuration, diagnosing, preventative maintenance, basic networking and security. It also confirms a technician’s understanding of customer service and communication skills needed to work with clients. Agricultural Mechanics (Test Code 2102)	This test is designed for program completers and entry-level employees in the agricultural mechanics field, measuring knowledge and skills in such topics as general safety, welding and mechanics, power and machinery, electrical power and process, agricultural structures, agribusiness, and environmental and natural resource systems.
